Disability Studies comprises three core themes: the history of disability; experiences of disability; and an array of policy, social, rehabilitative and other interventions.

The Centre aims to promote the inclusion and independence of people with disabilities through excellent research, teaching and service to the wider community.

The Centre offers qualifications and degrees in three main areas: Rehabilitation Studies, Developmental Disabilities and Disability Studies.

Its Steering Group includes members of academic staff from many departments and faculties, while a group of advisers represents advocates, family members and professionals.
